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Executive Summary

During the reporting period face-to-face contact took place between Jervois Global and land holders, in July, 2022, January, February, March and April 2023; itemised below.

Compliance with Community Consultation Strategy / Plan (sec 2.1.3(a))

Phone conversation and email correspondence kept landholders up to date with Nico Young Project details and proposed exploration dates.

Ongoing water bore monitoring continues.

July 2022

Face to face meetings with primary stakeholders M.S., P.A and B & E. A. to discuss land degradation due to excessive rainfall, and possible delays or modifications to drilling plans for March 2023.

October 2022

Face to face meetings with primary stakeholders M.S., P.A and B & E. A. to discuss land access requirements for drilling in early 2023. Meeting with the Young Development Group.

January 2023

Face to face meetings with primary stakeholders M.S., P.A to inspect land previously under water and assess protocol for drilling in 2023.

March 2023

Face to face meetings with primary stakeholder M.S. to discuss land access, inspect access routes and procedures for drilling program to start in March 2023.

Regarding on-going exploration; NICO Young project progress reports were sent by email to all relevant landholders. F2F meetings held with stakeholders in July, October and November, 2022, January, February and March 2023.

Executive Summary of Objectives (sec 2.1.3(b))

Landholder permission to conduct an exploration drilling program on their land in March 2023 confirmed and approved.

July 2022

- M.S. – July 26, 2022 to discuss excessive water damage due to rainfall and damage to land. Contingencies for drilling discussed and modifications to land access agreement.
- B & E. A. – July 26, 2022, to discuss exploration access permission for drilling
- P. A. – July 26, 2022, to discuss exploration access permission for Jan. 2023.

October, 2022
